LWML Mission Grant #29 Repairs for St. Paul's Lutheran School, Cullman, AL. St. Paul's Lutheran School has served the church and the Cullman community since 1887, and the current building was built in 1951.

The building has been through multiple tornadoes and there are now safety concerns which need to be addressed, including

replacement of windows, emergency doors, and updated heating technology. Because of its location, the school is a mission, reaching unchurched children and their families. Parents are encouraged to attend the daily chapel services and families attend Sunday Divine Service, especially when their child or children sing.

This grant would assist in the updating of the heating system and replacement of windows and emergency doors.

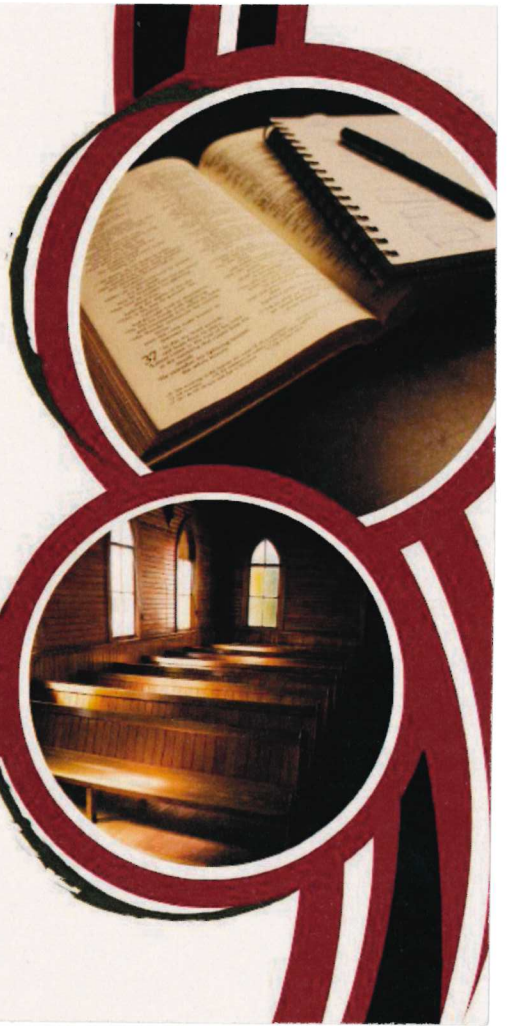

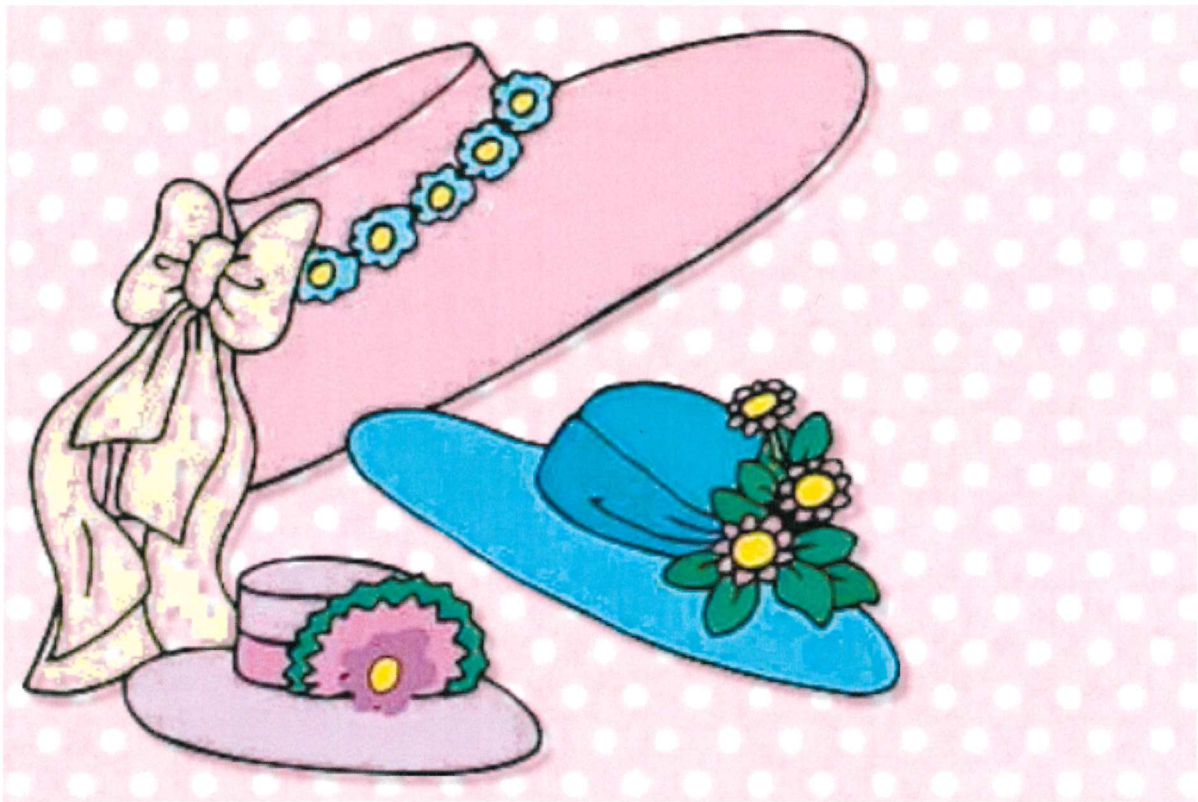

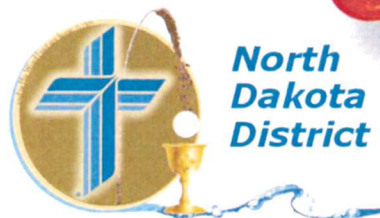
