#### Concordia's Financial Situation as of October 31st, 2024

We had some good offerings in October. As of October 31<sup>st</sup>, we were about \$20,000 BEHIND in giving versus spending. However, we historically get some good offerings in November & December. As Concordia's members give to the Lord's Church in November & December, we hope to end 2024 with no deficit or, better yet, in the black (as was the case at the end of 2023).




#### **Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,**


