Concordia's Financial Situation as of the end of October

At our November 24th council meeting the October budget report showed that we have received around \$280,000 in offerings as of the end of Oct. In November and December we will likely spend LESS than our approved budget for this year, but we will still need to bring in at least \$60,000 by the end of the vear to break even. As Concordia's members continue to give to Christ's Church we hope to end the year EVEN or, better yet, IN THE BLACK so that we can move forward in 2026 in a strong financial position and continue with ministry and mission for Christ's Church!


