Pastor Eckstein & Family on vacation from 12/25/23 — 1/04/24


Pastor Eckstein and his family will on vacation from 12/25/23 through 1/04/24. They will be traveling to the

Relief for Human Need Worldwide

As many of you know, the OGT North Dakota Branch sent our second shipment to the Bible Orphan Ministry in Zhytomir, Ukraine in December. The following excerpts are from a recent post of the group who is working to disseminate supplies to the people affected by the war. Please keep Alla and her colleagues in your prayers as they continue this dangerous work.

" It was already dark outside, and a terrible and piercing cold rain and wind were whistling. We were happily rushing to the Kherson region! And then bang! In the forest at 2:00AM, far from a settlement, at a speed of 100 km per hour, our tire burst! I immediately turned to the Lord with my thought. 'Do you want to warn us against something? Why did you do this? I thank you that we didn't roll over in the van and die!!!' God's peace and calm filled our hearts. While the guys were changing our tire, we were freezing. But we were happy that they did it in 1 hour and we drove on."

"Having looked at the weather forecast in advance, we were happy that it was supposed to be 9+ and sunny. I even brought sunglasses with me. How naïve I was! But upon arrival, we were greeted with the exact opposite, changeable and cloudy weather, cold wind and rain."

"People were already waiting for us, half a day in the cold rain and wind. They knew we were coming. They ran to meet us, hugged us and cried. Local (people) poured out all their pain and grief to us, sharing their experiences during the occupation. It still does not fit in my head to hear the horrific stories. I have only one answer, as it is written in the Bible. 'slanderers, blasphemers, assailants, boasters, puffers, inventors of evil...(Romans 1:30)'.....How long O, Lord? The soul cries and the heart cries out! 'Lord, how long shall the wicked triumph? How long shall they utter and speak hard things: and all the workers of iniquity boast themselves? They break in pieces thy people, O LORD, and afflict thine heritage. They slay the widow and the stranger, and murder the fatherless. Yet they say, the LORD shall not see, neither shall the God of Jacob regard it (Psalm 94:3-7)' "

"For the second time our vehicle stalled. But how timely it happened when there was another van nearby that came on business to our friends! If we had broken down later or earlier, or in another place, there would have been no one to help us! Because the village is large, many locals had their cars stolen by the Russian military by force or at gunpoint. They would break them down and leave only a pile of unusable scrap metal or simply shoot them. We were shocked at how the lord does everything on time and is never late! Maybe that's why we broke down on the road?"

"The shelling of the surrounding villages, explosions, and threats of air strikes were heard all day long. According to the locals the day before we arrived, a village 7 kilometers away was heavily shelled. We were 25 kilometers from the front line. Again, we could hear the sounds of various artillery from the other side. And the explosions were like thunder. But this did not stop us, we continued to distribute aid and witness to people." "We witnessed and shared the Gospel wherever we could, in crowds, in homes, to passersby, and over a cup of tea in homes. And how timely it was when we were freezing outside in the cold rain and wind!"

"Do you remember how Jesus loved to go door to door and share the good news? It is in the circle of friends and acquaintances that the table is set, even with the simplest, most modest things, but most importantly with love. It unites and warms hearts."

"Kherson residents sincerely thanked us for our help and hugged us! The next day, one woman called and said how timely you brought us the socks! We are so warm now."

"We didn't sleep for 2 nights in a row, having traveled about 1500 km, we were very cold. I was shaking like an aspen leaf on a tree from the cold, testifying to people. We could not warm up for a long time. My bones seemed to be frozen to the core. Several times we almost got into a car accident, under constant shelling, mined by locals, we saw how the Lord led us and kept us safe!!! Praise God!!!"

"The next day after we returned home, a blizzard began, and the roads we were traveling on were covered with snow 1.5-2 meters deep! Passenger buses and various cars were driving off the road and getting into car accidents! Some roads were completely blocked. Unfortunately, there are some dead people. But even in this, the Lord blessed our trip that we returned home in time before this blizzard began! Wow!"

"We sincerely thank you for your prayers!!! We felt them and saw the hand of God and His wing covering us from the enemy's weapons!!!"

"We sincerely thank you for your participation in this vital project!!! You can't even imagine what it means to every soul and every heart broken by grief!!! We sincerely thank you for touching the souls of every Ukrainian with your kindness! The people of Kherson not only feel the warmth of your hearts but also see your love in action!!! May the Lord bless each of you abundantly!!!"

We are all God's children despite our differences, challenges, or experiences. Journeys Lutheran School prepares students in Grades 3–12 with unique learning challenges to maximize their God-given spiritual, academic, physical, emotional, and social potential. The resources and experience of Journeys provides academic help to students and provides an opportunity for their lives to be touched by the Holy Spirit through devotions, prayer, Christian counseling, religion classes, and personal witness.

Grant funds will purchase two 15-passenger vans. The vans will allow Journeys to reach and teach more students and meet their academic and spiritual needs. In addition to the school bus already in use, the vans will provide alternative means to reach students in areas outside of Milwaukee. 
