# The first Sunday of June is Mite Sunday

Thank you to everyone for donating to the noisy mites. We collected **\$121.97** in May.

We collect our mites to help fund all of our District and National LWML mission grant projects for this biennium....the mission grant being featured this month is:

LWML Mission Grant #31 **Breaking Generational Poverty** in Detroit, Camp Restore Detroit, MI. Sixty percent of the children in Detroit live in poverty, which means parents are often out of the house trying to make ends meet, school time is often spent focused on basic needs such as food and clothing, and the educational, emotional, spiritual, mental, and physical well-being of the children suffers. The ability to learn and grow along with peers becomes a seemingly unattainable dream, which sets the foundation for the cycle of generational poverty to continue and the number of children in poverty continues to increase. Camp Restore Detroit has been called to be a partner in breaking the cycle of generational poverty in Detroit by working with families and community leaders in a Christ-centered atmosphere, where families can learn and grow with access to education and needed resources.

The grant funds will be used to purchase desks, tables, and bookshelves for their outreach centers, tools for all aspects of learning including materials for Bible studies, tutoring, art, and science. Plans include a place to learn technological and vocational skills for adults. Through education and God's

love the cycle of generational poverty can be broken.
