Concordia's Financial Situation as of September 30th, 2024

As of the end of September we are about \$40,000 BEHIND in giving versus spending. That's the bad news. The good news is we have about \$30,000 padding. However, our \$30,000 padding will quickly be used up if we do not make up for our current \$40,000 deficit with offerings given October through December. Historically, we have larger offerings October through December – and so as Concordia's members trust God and continue to give to Concordia's mission and ministry, I pray we can end 2024 with no deficit or, better yet, a surplus as we did last year.

Award is the Civil Air Patrol

prestigious award with C/ Lt. Col
Andrew Douglas being the 4438<sup>th</sup>

recipient since the awards inception in 1998.

The Eaker Award marks the completion of Phase IV of the CAP Cadet Program, recognizing sustained excellence in all four areas of cadet life: leadership, aerospace, fitness, and character. In addition, cadets will have graduated from an academically intensive leadership academy to qualify for this honor. Douglas joined Civil Air Patrol in November 2020, and has earned Community Service, Commander's Commendation, and Achievement Ribbon. He received the Missouri Wing VFW Officer of the Year, North Central Region Frank Brewer Aerospace Award, and the Sedalia, MO Squadron AFSA Sargeant of the Year Awards. Douglas is a qualified Mission Radio Operator, Ground Team Member Level III Skills Evaluator, Urban Direction-Finding Team Skills Evaluator, and Mission Staff Assistant Skills Evaluator. He is currently working on his qualifications for **Unmanned Aerial System** Technician.

Douglas graduated from North Central Region Cadet Leadership School in August of 2023. He currently serves as Cadet Commander of the James Valley Composite Squadron of Jamestown, ND, and the North Central Region Representative for the North Dakota Wing at the Region Cadet Advisory Council. He has served in various positions in the Missouri Wing. Douglas joined the North Dakota Wing in January of 2024.

C/Lt Col Douglas is the son of Joshua and Angelina Douglas of Steele, ND. He enjoys spending time with his 3 siblings: Lille, Patton, and Edith Douglas and his Great Pyrenees, Yuri. He plans to earn his pilots license in the next year and wants to serve in either the military or in law enforcement when he graduates in 2025.

General Ira C. Eaker was one of the forefathers of an independent Air Force. During WWII, Eaker rose to the grade of lieutenant general and commanded the Eight Air Force, 'The Mighty Eighth" force of strategic bombers. Even as a General, Eaker preferred to lead from the front, personally flying B-17 precision bombing missions over occupied France and Germany. The James Valley Composite Squadron is the recipient of multiple Quality Cadet Unit Awards and has participated in many events across the Wing and Region.

#### **About Civil Air Patrol**

Now celebrating its 82<sup>nd</sup> year, Civil Air Patrol is the official auxiliary of the US Air Force and as such is a member of its Total Force. In Its auxiliary role, CAP operates a fleet of 560 singleengine Cessna aircraft and more than 2,100 small Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) and performs about 90% of all search and rescue operations within the contiguous United States as

tasked by the Air Force rescue Coordination Center. Often using innovative cellphone forensics and radar analysis software. CAP was credited by the AFRCC with saving 151 lives during the past fiscal year. CAP's 56,000 members also perform homeland security, disaster relief, and drug interdiction missions at the request of federal, state, and local agencies. As a nonprofit organization, CAP plays a leading role in aerospace education using national academic standardsbased STEM education resources. Members also serve as members to more than 22,000 young people participating in CAP's Cadet Programs. 


