Concordia's Financial Situation as of August 31st, 2024

As of the end of August we are about \$36,000 BEHIND in giving versus spending. That's the bad news. The good news is we have about \$35,000 padding. However, our \$35,000 padding will quickly be used up if we do not make up for our current \$35,000 deficit with offerings given September through December. Last year at this time we had a similar deficit and by the end of December of 2023 we ended the year with a \$13,000 SURPLUS! Therefore, as Concordia's members trust God and continue to give to Concordia's mission and ministry, I pray we can end 2024 with no deficit or, better yet, a surplus as we did last year.

After the 10:30AM Service on Sunday, 10/27, we will have our "Fall Festival Pot-Luck" during which members are encouraged to bring food dishes from various ethnic traditions – be that German, Norwegian, Italian, Russian, Chinese, Moroccan, etc. Also, after the "Pot-Luck" there will be an important voters meeting during which we will 1) elect members who've agreed to serve in various positions for 2025 and 2) discuss and approve our 2025 budget.
