After not receiving a seminary candidate in either 2024 or 2025, the tri-parish of Carrington/ Cooperstown/Binford has decided that they will NOT be calling a full time pastor. Instead, the congregations of Cooperstown/ Binford will continue to be served by pastor Bob Hill and Grace Lutheran in Carrington will continue to be served by pastor Eckstein. Pastor Eckstein will be serving Carrington for a Service and Bible class on Saturday mornings and usually spending the late afternoon/evening (4:00PM to 9:00PM) on Tuesdays in Carrington for office work, shut-in visits, bible study and other things that may be needed. The current reality in the "Lutheran Church- Missouri Synod" is that we have a shortage of pastors. Other LCMS pastors in North Dakota are also serving other congregations in addition to their main congregation which is common in rural states where there are many smaller LCMS congregations that cannot afford a full time pastor. This will likely be the "new normal" in the future until the

Lord provides us with more pastors in the LCMS.

We collect our mites to help fund all our District and National LWML mission grant projects for this biennium....the 33 mission grants, selected at the LWML Convention in June, were chosen from a list of 47 proposed projects.

One grant that was accepted was. #2 Help for Ukraine's Orphans and Displaced Persons, Orphan Grain Train, Europe, \$100,000

Orphan Grain Train (OGT) has been involved in humanitarian aid to Ukraine since the war began. In the past year, seventeen shipments of donated food, clothing, and medical supplies were sent to various locations in the Ukraine. (Several shipments originated from the North Dakota Branch or included items sent by North Dakota). OGT is assisting twelve orphanages in the Kherson area and three orphanages in the Kyiv area. OGT is working with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine and other Christian churches as it distributes the aid. The impact the donations have is both lifesaving and soul-saving. The donated supplies assist people who have lost all their worldly goods and help children whose parents have been killed in the war. Through acts of mercy shown by followers of Jesus, recipients see the love of God. This grant will cover the cost of shipping up to seven containers loaded with food, clothing, and medical supplies to the country of Ukraine.






