### Concordia's Financial Situation as of July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024

As of the end of July we are about \$35,000 BEHIND in giving versus spending. That's the bad news. The good news is that 1) we are usually behind this time of year and our best giving is September through December, and 2) we have about \$50,000 padding to cover the current deficit. However, our \$50,000 padding will quickly be used up if we do not make up for our current \$35,000 deficit with offerings giving September through December.

The good news is that we had a similar deficit this time last year and by the end of December of 2023 we ended the year with a \$13,000 SURPLUS! Therefore, as Concordia's members trust God and continue to give to Concordia's mission and ministry, I pray we can end 2024 with no deficit or, better yet, a surplus as we did last year.




